



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## The Border Bottleneck




Studies in the mid-2000s demonstrated the need for expansion of border Infrastructure to address increasing demand and inspection requirements

Long Border Wait Times (2 – 4 hours) causing:

- Loss of Trade/Productivity (estimated at over \$6 billion in gross output)
- Loss of Over 50,000 jobs
- Loss of Local Sales/Sales Taxes
- Increased Air Pollution Emissions
